

Reference: Concession Agreement May 2016

Paragraph 1.10, concession responsibilities of the Kitsap Live Steamer

- 1. Kitsap Live Steamers 2016 year was a very successful year, we our increased ridership, and membership. We added two holidays to the schedule (July 4th and Labor Day) for a trial period. They were very successful and have added them to our 2017 calendar as scheduled operating days, we also hosted some special needs service for South Kitsap Schools, plans are to expand this service for this year is to include Central and North Kitsap school Districts This year we have included a few Sunday runs as a trial if they are as successful as our holiday runs last year we will add them as a scheduled event for 2018.
- 2. A new Locomotive was purchased February 2016 and placed it into service. As indicated on our 2016 yearly financial statement Locomotives are very expensive. Include our track expansion at about \$100.00 per 10 feet it's sure to keep our treasurers pencil sharp.
- 3. We are addressing our ADA responsibilities and are constructing a ADA (wheelchair) riding car. Some hand railing adjustment will be made to our tressel for the extra width the car requires. A set aside loading area next to our steaming bays will allow for easy safe loading of our mobility challenged members and guests.
- 4. The items below are our planned improvements over the next 10 years.
 - 1. Construct a covered work (steel carport style area over three of our steaming racks. We have a very limited covered area now. The new covering will allow us to maintain our equipment sheltered from the rain. Spring of 2017
 - 2. Complete the track extension section A. (a turnaround "Y") spring 2018.
 - 3. Complete section B. of the expansion, a young members track (isolated from the main line for safety), and new K.L.S. picnic area the fall 2018.
 - 4. Late fall 2017 or Spring 2018 our new Hudson locomotive will be placed into service. The Hudson is a steam powered locomotive with new riding cars. We will then have four passenger trains available for service.
 - 5. Finalize the storage building construction plans early 2018. Secure funding for project.

- 6. Start construction of new storage building the summer of 2018 complete by spring 2019
- 7. Extend a new track expansion North of our current set aside area 2021
- 8. Extend the main line to the skate park/ batting cage parking lot with a new station. Providing passenger train service between both ends of the park. 2023
- 9. Rebuild or replace our two aging locomotives. These engines are close to twenty years old and will need major rework or replacement within the next 5 to 10 years. 2024-2027.
- 5. K.L.S. would like to thank the Park Board and Department employees for your support and enjoyable working relationship. We at K.L.S. wish to work with the Parks Department and integrate our 10-year plan with the Parks projected improvements. Our long range plan is to be able to transport passengers between our current depot location, future planned parking areas, the ball fields, and skate park.

TRAIN RUN AT SKAGEN'S IN SHELTON – June 17th



"On Track"

Track Report for KLS Order Board, April 2017 As we approach the beginning of our 2017 season, only the short loop is open for travel. The north loop is closed; track panels have been taken out in two locations to provide access for the contractor hired by the county to remove the diseased trees. The latest information from the county forester indicates that the cutting will begin on Monday, April 10th, following our opening weekend. That could still change - it has slid several times already. At least the contractor understands our need to have some portion of our main line open for trains on our scheduled weekends, so he has promised to do his best to work with us.

We will be removing three track panels on the short loop at the end of opening day, again to enable the contractor to bring in his heavy tracked machine that takes down the trees without damaging our track. He plans to work first in the area inside our short loop, then he'll move north and west of the short loop. We will be re-laying the three panels of the short track early on the day of the Easter Egg run. I won't know if we must take it out again until late in the week preceding the Easter Egg weekend; that depends on how many trees the county forester tells the contractor to cut down. And, there is no estimate available yet regarding when the removal of all the diseased trees in the area of our railroad will be completed. We will remain flexible and work with the parks department, the forester and the tree cutting contractor.

Ultimately, the removal of the dead trees will be a benefit to KLS. It should simplify work on our planned mainline extension, and it will significantly reduce the chance of dead trees falling onto and damaging our track.

- In progress changing kick switches to George Hokes' improved mechanism.
- Completed BNSF Dash 9 Oil Change and Lube job.
- Completed Milwaukee SW1500 Oil Change and Lube job.
- Completed service on brakes and trucks of all riding cars.
- Washed and cleaned all riding cars.
- Installed LED lights on the Milwaukee SW1500 (Tom Huffman).
- Supporting tree cutting operations with track section removal/replacement.

- Repair and straighten yard area barbed wire and chain link fence.

- Fix leaking container van roofs.

As we near our regular run season members will be bringing in their train equipment to run and/or store. Please remember to cleanup after yourself, lock up and properly secure equipment after use.
